Climate Change and Renewable Energy

As a country highly vulnerable to climate change, the overarching aim of the sector is to bring this issue and its impacts to a global platform. Our focus on renewable energy is an extension of our work within climate change because alternative energies have the potential to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Infrastructure Development, focusing on Water and Sanitation

We are focused on addressing problems relating to a lack of health/ hygiene awareness, as well as the inaccessibility of basic services such as safe drinking water and sanitation facilities. Projects within this sector involve the integration of two main components: construction (the building of tube wells, latrines, taps and reservoirs, etc.), and social development and research (community empowerment, training, and workshops).

Knowledge Management

We recognize the power of information-sharing and, accordingly, the value of education; as such, we promote knowledge generation and dissemination through seminars, training, workshops and awareness-raising campaigns.

Social Development, Gender, and Inclusion

Our willingness to share equitable resource opportunities with the country’s most disadvantaged groups – such as women, the socially excluded, and the very poor – has been embedded in the operation of all its initiatives, as well as in their planning and conceptualization stages.
